 - Describe the attitude and awareness that is important to providing quality service to all individuals.

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WHAT DOES THIS ALL MEAN?

LGBTQ older adults need services but often do not receive them and because of fear, may "go back into the closet."

LGBTQ seniors often lack traditional support systems and are at higher risk of being isolated, living alone, and aging alone.

LGBTQ seniors are faced with issues that create increased risk for depression, substance abuse, unnecessary institutionalization and premature death.

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Gender identity and sexual orientation will be treated like other human characteristics.
LGBTQ persons will be treated with respect as human beings rather than "sexual differences."
LGBTQ families will be recognized as one of many legitimate forms of family and will be given the rights and privileges of all families.

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
